IV. Assignments

Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

1. Write a two to three page (double-spaced) reflection paper one of the viewpoints expressed in *Psychology and Christianity: Five Views*. A reflection paper identifies the subject(s) under consideration and gives a summarization of your reaction to the material with evidence from the material to support your suppositions. Reflection papers answer the questions "Did you agree with the claims of the author?," "What did you learn?,"



- "What misconceptions did you have that the author helped you correct?" Footnote all citations. For further help consult <u>How to Write a Reflection Paper</u>.
- 2. Write a 15-20 page (double-spaced) paper summarizing and critiquing Cognitive Behavioral Therapy from a biblical counseling perspective. This paper should articulate a clear thesis that rests upon sound biblical and theological argumentation and that addresses the strongest counterarguments to the thesis. Provide a cover page, bibliography, and footnote all citations. Be sure to utilize Kate L. Turabian, *A Manual for Writers of Research Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*, 9th Ed., (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Press, 2018) for pagination/citation questions. Refrain from relying upon secondary or internet sources.
